Progress report on the use of certified sustainable¹ palm oil in food and animal feed in the Netherlands.



Palm oil certified as sustainable has to meet the principles and criteria of the RSPO

- The production of palm oil must not cause deforestation or damage any HCV or HCS forest. HCV and HCS forests in the managed area must be identified and protected or enhanced.
- There are clear requirements relating to labour standards and working conditions Protection of rights of vulnerable groups of workers
- such as migrants and women
- Provide a decent living wage (DLW).

sustainability concept. Our concern is that this is partially happening in the export markets outside Western Europe. Unfortunately, non-sustainable palm oil is still imported there. Just as palm oil free products, this has unfortunate effects on the world's biodiversity. Increasing the demand to sustainable palm oil contributes, on the other hand, to the protection of precious ecosystems as the rainforests."

- Working together with other (international) initiatives towards 100% sustainable palm oil in Europe
- Stimulate the use of sustainable palm oil by raising awareness of its importance. Support EU legislation for the import of sustainable
- and deforestation-free palm oil.

Dutch Alliance for Sustainable Palm Oil

The Dutch Alliance for Sustainable Palm Oil (DASPO) is a partnership of nine industry associations, supported by IDH, The Sustainable Trade Initiative. The DASPO is an initiative of MVO - The Netherlands Oils and Fats Industry.



Zoos for sustainable palm oil:

Zoos are key players when it comes to the promotion of sustainable palm oil. Besides being a major force in the conservation of biodiversity worldwide, an increasing number of zoos are committed to supporting the transformation towards 100% sustainable palm oil. Chester Zoo, one of the biggest zoos in the UK, is one of them. Cat Barton (Field Conservation Manager at Chester Zoo) shares with us how Chester is driving change:





Protection of the orang-utan

Cat Barton: "At Chester Zoo, we advocate for the sustainable production of palm oil. We work closely with partners in <u>Malaysian</u> <u>Borneo</u> carrying out research, education and reforestation activities to protect species such as Bornean orangutans. As part of our mission to prevent extinction, we engage with stakeholders in the palm oil supply chain from other NGO's to field partners, international zoos manufacturers and retailers to find solutions to reversing the environmental impact of unsustainable palm oil.'

'Sustainable Palm Oil City Challenge'

Cat Barton: "In 2017 we launched an ambitious major new conservation campaign to make Chester the world's first <u>sustainable palm oil city.</u> Our sustainable palm oil campaign aims to increase demand for sustainable palm oil one city at a time; we wanted to do something innovative and game-changing that could have a significant impact on shaping the future of our planet. We achieved sustainable palm oil city status in 2019, and since then other cities have taken on the project, with Oxford and Newquay being the next in line to achieve the status."

"We believe that increasing demand for sustainable, deforestation-free commodities in our supply chains is vital to protect the future of our ecosystems and biodiversity. We can only do this by working collaboratively and increasing demand for sustainable production systems. The support of cities within the UK and beyond is key. We, therefore, encourage cities in the Netherlands to join us in the sustainable palm oil city challenge".





What can we do in the Netherlands?

- Keep supporting sustainable palm oil and buy products that use sustainable palm oil.
- Support initiatives in producing countries to protect and restore valuable landscapes together with palm oil suppliers.

RSPO tradesystems

- Segregated: sustainable palm oil from different certified sources that is kept separate throughout the supply chain.
- Mass Balance: sustainable palm oil from certified sources that is administratively monitored throughout the supply chain.
- Book & Claim: a certificate that represents a certain amount of palm oil that is sustainably produced somewhere in the world.
